

Overview

Course overview:

If you are talented and hard working, a career in television journalism is for you. It will take you to a good salary package and perhaps even fame.

Television journalism has become so strong that it has produced its own stars such as Barkha Dutt ,Rajat Sharma, Vinod Dua, Rajdeep Sardesai, and the likes who have carved a niche for themselves.

TV news anchor positions combines journalism and entertainment. Anchors are the hosts of broadcast news shows. They read the main stories, either alone or in pairs, and are responsible for carrying the tone of the broadcast. Newscasters, also known as news anchors, embody the news station's identity as the most recognizable members of the news team. They read stories, conduct in-studio interviews and mediate discussions on television. Newscasters can write, edit and produce the news, and they usually have prior experience as reporters.

A news anchor examines, interprets news stories and introduces videotaped news or live transmissions from on-the-scene reporters. A newscaster at large stations and networks usually specializes in a particular type of news, such as sports or weather.

Sometimes news anchors interview guests and moderate panels or discussions. Anchoring is also about sensibly steering a discussion, pacifying an outburst and controlling the program. Thus, it is not only essential to have presence of mind but also a fine wit to get away when the tables are turned against you.

Some provide commentary for the audience during parades and other events. For instance, in PTC (piece to camera)- one must learn the art of communication which comprises pause, stress, expression, punctuation, voice

modulation and so on. ??

News reading: Television news reader looks very excited to see the younger generation. Today, electronic media is full of news readers. News Reading skills can be learned from experience. News by reading the details associated with the profession other than your own comes to stay connected. To become a successful news reader candidate must have a tight grip on two languages either English or Hindi. News reading students aspiring career in the field should focus on the pronunciation. Common sense, understanding of news, confidence, body language etc. are factors which can support good news. Pleasing personality, good sense of news, facial expressions are friendly and the selection of words correctly help in becoming a successful news reader. Work on improving the diction, accent and vocabulary of the language in which one desires to be a newsreader. Most commonly, one must have command over spoken English and Hindi. Efforts must be made to speak words in a neutral accent. Excellence in communication skills, ability to read fluently, being very interactive and great presence of mind are the qualities that are sought after. One must also be well read. A good knowledge of current affairs is needed.

News Reporters generate ideas for stories and features and follow leads from news agencies, the police, the public, press conferences and other sources and research, investigate and collate evidence and information to support a story using relevant information sources such as the internet, archives, databases, etc.

- * Reporters take notes and at their office, they organize the material, determine the focus or emphasis, write their stories, and edit accompanying video material.
- Television reporters often compose stories and report "live" from the scene. Many reporters enter information or write stories using laptop computers and electronically submit the material to their offices from remote locations.
- ▼ Some reporters specialize in fields such as health, politics,

foreign affairs, sports, theater, consumer affairs, social events, science, business, or religion.

- Investigative reporters cover stories that may take many days or weeks of information gathering. Some television stations use teams of reporters instead of assigning each reporter one specific topic, allowing reporters to cover a greater variety of stories.

This specialization course will eliminate your fear of facing the camera, fine-tune your speech, and mould your latent talent for television journalism. Students will also be exposed to micro specialized fields in news journalism such as promowriting and promo-producing for news.

This course provides a solid grounding on all aspects of studio and production skills. The practical training sessions will sharpen your skills for news gathering for radio and provide techniques for presenting and interviewing. You will also be familiarized with newsroom routines and procedures. We also help students make the most of their voices. Instead of trying to change their voices or accents, we strive to help them use their voices more effectively.

Job Opportunities:

With the growing importance of media today, the opportunities in the field are numerous and the job is also demanding and exhilarating at the same time.

A career in broadcast journalism may involve writing, producing, editing, reporting or directing the news at a television. One can join as a

Broadcast journalism salary could vary between 18-25k at the entry level and can reach up to 2- lakhs as one gains the industry experience.

Class Timing & Duration:

The classes for this course takes place 5 days a week. There are two batches for the same: 10:00 am to 1:00 pm/2:00 pm to 5:00pm. (1:00 -2:00 is the lunch break) Batch is allocated as per student's convenience depending upon the availability in the preferred batch.

This is a one year program. The 1st semester (of 6 months duration) includes class room training in which both theory (1 hour) and practical classes (2 hours) are conducted. In the 2nd semester (of 6 months duration) students will work on their projects and will join channel as an intern.

Course Fee:

The total fee in lump sum mode is Rs.55,000/. In installment method, it becomes Rs.60,000/- . 50% at the time of admission and balance after gap of one month in two installment.
